Symphonia for South Africa offers a variety of programmes and workshops that work towards social cohesion and large scale social change in South Africa. We ignite a national debate on the way active citizens contribute to the education of all children. Through our flagship project, **Partners for Possibility (PfP)**; the **School Leadership Forum (SLF)** programme and **Community Building** workshops, we promote and facilitate leadership development opportunities for business leaders, school principals and their school management teams.

Partners for Possibility for South Africa

Our flagship project, **Partners for Possibility (PfP)** creates an opportunity for business and community leaders to develop their leadership skills while at the same time making a significant contribution to education in South Africa. We work with school principals with the aim of reigniting community participation in schools as a collaborative investment in the future of education.

The goal of this project is to contribute to the improvement of learner outcomes by providing a significant, systemic shift in the leadership and culture in schools.

School Leadership Forums (SLF)

Symphonia for South Africa, in collaboration with MySchool and the Faculty of Economic and Management Sciences at the University of the Western Cape and the University of Johannesburg, is hosting a series of capacity building workshops for school principals. These events give experienced academics, business professionals and community leaders the opportunity to offer workshops that empower principals to deal with challenges at school and community level by providing them with practical solutions. Key themes such as fundraising, effective leadership, coaching, diversity management, community collaboration and teacher motivation are discussed. These workshops are free to all principals – and give these leaders within our community the opportunity to engage with their peers and share valuable information.



Community Building

Through the active engagement and bringing together of people across diverse sectors we create communities that can work towards a common, more prosperous future. This is achieved through the *Language of Leadership* workshops, which aim to create opportunities for varied communities to come together for two days. They engage in a personal, moving and deliberate process, based on global best practice methodologies developed by organisational development expert Peter Block.
